**WHAT THESE BILLS DO:**

These bills require a research institution or product testing facility that intends to euthanize or destroy a dog or cat, to offer this animal to an animal shelter or rescue organization or private placement for the purpose of placing/rehoming it.

**WHY YOU SHOULD SUPPORT THESE BILLS:**

These bills afford an opportunity for dogs and cats to live a life in a home as an adopted pet once their time in the research laboratory has come to an end.

NAIA (National Animal Interest Alliance) has developed a program for placing animals used in product testing called “Homes for Animal Heroes” -- <https://www.naiaonline.org/issues-programs/homes-for-animal-heroes/> -- so these animals can be carefully placed in adoptive homes.

An Act protecting research animals.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after  
2 Section 174D the following section:-

3 (a) Section 174D1/2. As used in this section, the following words shall have the  
4 following meanings, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

5 “Animal rescue organization”, an organization whose mission and practice is the  
6 placement of abandoned, unwanted, neglected or abused animals, that does not obtain dogs or  
7 cats from a breeder or broker for payment or compensation and that is an organization exempt  
8 from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the federal Internal Revenue Code or corresponding  
9 sections of that code.

10           “Animal shelter”, a facility operated, owned or maintained by an animal rescue  
11 organization that exists for the purpose of receiving, maintaining, caring for, transporting or  
12 transferring ownership of a domestic animal, but not a foster home.

13           “Product testing facility”, a facility that is engaged in animal research for the testing of  
14 consumer products.

15           “Research Facility”, a higher education research facility that utilizes dogs or cats for  
16 educational, medical or scientific research that receives public funds or a facility that provides  
17 research through a contractual agreement with a higher education research facility

18           (b) A research facility or product testing facility shall, after the completion of any testing  
19 or research involving a dog or cat that does not require euthanasia of the animal upon the  
20 termination of the study as defined and approved by the research or testing protocol, assess the  
21 health of the animal and determine whether the animal is suitable for adoption. Except as  
22 otherwise provided in subsection (c), a research facility or product testing facility that intends to  
23 euthanize a dog or cat shall, before euthanizing the dog or cat, make a reasonable effort to offer  
24 the dog or cat for adoption to an individual, an animal shelter or an animal rescue organization  
25 for the purpose of facilitating the adoption of said dog or cat to a permanent adoptive home. A  
26 research facility or product testing facility may enter into a collaborative agreement with an  
27 individual, an animal shelter or an animal rescue organization for the purpose of carrying out the  
28 provisions of this subsection. A research facility, product testing facility, animal shelter or  
29 animal rescue organization involved with the adoption of a dog or cat used for research or testing  
30 shall make reasonable efforts to adhere to the principles of (i) facilitating permanent adoptions  
31 and discouraging post-adoption transfers, (ii) selecting adopters for willingness and ability to

32 keep the animal permanently, provide an appropriate living space and accept lifelong  
33 responsibility for the animal's care; and (iii) ensuring that collaboration with an individual, an  
34 animal shelter or an animal rescue organization should only occur after careful review of the  
35 entity's mission statement (if an animal shelter or an animal rescue organization), reputation,  
36 history of involvement with animal adoption and criminal history.

37 (c) A research facility or product testing facility is not required to offer a dog or cat to an  
38 individual, animal shelter or rescue organization pursuant to subsection (b) if the dog or cat: (i)  
39 manifests a behavioral or medical defect that poses a risk to the health and safety of the public;  
40 or (ii) manifests symptoms of a disease, injury, congenital or hereditary condition that adversely  
41 affects, or is likely to adversely affect, the health of the dog or cat. The attending veterinarian of  
42 the research facility or product testing facility or designee shall be responsible for assessing the  
43 suitability of the dog or cat and determining its availability for adoption under this section.

44 (d) A facility that is required to offer dogs and cats for adoption under this section shall  
45 owe no duty of care to an animal shelter or rescue organization that accepts the animal or to a  
46 person or entity that adopts those animals, whether through the organizations or through private  
47 placement. No assumption of responsibility or liability for injuries, property damage or other  
48 damages or losses shall be incurred by a research institution or product testing facility on account  
49 of the adoption or placement of a dog or cat pursuant to the provisions of this act.

50 (e) Nothing in this act shall require a research institution or product testing facility to  
51 offer a dog or cat for adoption to an animal shelter, rescue organization or through private  
52 placement if the dog or cat is a newborn dog or cat in need of maternal care and not appropriate  
53 for adoption.

3 (a) Section 174D1/2. As used in this section, the following words shall have the  
4 following meanings, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

5 “Animal rescue organization”, an organization whose mission and practice is the  
6 placement of abandoned, unwanted, neglected or abused animals, that does not obtain dogs or  
7 cats from a breeder or broker for payment or compensation and that is an organization exempt  
8 from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the federal Internal Revenue Code or corresponding  
9 sections of that code.
